



Henderson Veterans Memorial Wall

BRIGADIER GENERAL TROY E. ARMSTRONG

Brigadier General Troy E. Armstrong has served as the Nevada National Guard's Assistant Adjutant General - Army since March of 2023. In his position, he commands and oversees the more than 3,300 Soldiers in the Nevada Army Guard.



Armstrong has served in every command position from platoon leader through brigade command. He mobilized in 2001 with the 72nd Military Police Company in support of Operation Noble Eagle and again in 2003 and 2005 as the unit's Commander in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Hurricane Katrina relief efforts. In 2007, Armstrong was assigned as the Senior Enemy Prisoner of War Officer for the 140th Military Police Brigade Liaison Detachment. In 2008, he deployed with the unit in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and served as the Deputy J7 for Task Force 134 (Detention Operations), Multi-National Forces Iraq.

From 2009-2015, Armstrong served in the 17th Sustainment Brigade as a Battalion and Brigade Support Operations Officer and Deputy Brigade Commander. In 2015, he assumed command of the 17th Special Troops Battalion and deployed with the unit in 2016 in support of Operation Spartan Shield, providing theatre gateway and personnel services support throughout CENTCOM. In 2018, following his assignment to Joint Forces Headquarters and his completion of Senior Services College, Armstrong assumed command of the 17th Sustainment Brigade.

His awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal (2 OLC), the Meritorious Service Medal (2 OLC), the Army Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, the Combat Action Badge, the Joint Meritorious Unit Award, the Iraq Campaign Medal (2 Bronze Stars) and the Global War on Terrorism Expedition and Service Medals.

Dedicated in 1994, the Henderson Veterans Memorial Wall is our city's tribute to the veterans of our nation's military who were Henderson residents at the time of their service. The panels that make up the wall honor the generations of service men and women from Henderson who have served our country.

The Deceased Veterans Panel memorializes all deceased veterans who resided in Henderson prior to 1980. The Killed In Action Panel memorializes service members who were killed in action or died as a result of wounds suffered from enemy action and who were residents of Henderson after 1980.

Three panels recognize veterans who were Henderson residents during the Vietnam and Persian Gulf Wars and the Global War on Terror.

Henderson was founded in defense of our country during World War II. The City continues to recognize our military men, women and families for their sacrifice and devotion to the principles of freedom.
