## **Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan Inspections**

The City of Henderson has adopted Storm Water Regulations in response to mandates from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Nevada Department of Environmental Protection (NDEP). Part of these regulations require Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) inspections on all land disturbances one acre or larger. The following outlines how to obtain the required inspections:

- 1. A grading permit must be applied for. The grading permit application submittal package must include (as stated on the submittal checklist):
  - a. A copy of the Storm Water Discharge "Notice of Intent" (NOI) application and the receipt for fees paid, or the letter of authorization from the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection, proving that the project site is covered under NVR100000.
  - A Construction Permit Submittal Checklist and the Performance Standards Compliance Checklist from Appendix B of the Las Vegas Valley BMP Guidance Manual that is available at <a href="www.lvstormwater.com">www.lvstormwater.com</a>.
  - c. SWPPP inspection fees (\$105.00 per acre).
- 2. After the City has accepted the submittal package and a grading permit has been created, a Storm Water (SWPPP) inspection is required to verify that Best Management Practices are installed at the project site. This inspection must be completed prior to issuance of the grading permit. Contact Quality Control at 267-3144 to schedule the inspection (Inspection Code 2720).
- 3. After the grading permit has been issued and throughout construction of the project, periodic SWPPP inspections will automatically be performed by Public Works Quality Control or Building and Fire Safety inspectors (depending on the type of grading permit issued).
- 4. The Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) must be on-site, in a clearly marked location, accessible to City of Henderson inspectors at all times.

If a grading permit is not required for the project, but it has been determined by the City of Henderson that a Storm Water Prevention Program Plan is required, then the necessary inspections (including fee requirements) may be established on a different permit type.
