


BACKGROUND

CLARK COUNTY REGIONAL FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE MANUAL

- The document sets forth both policies and procedures by which the maintenance of the drainage and flood control facilities will be achieved to assure their proper working order at the time of need and complies with the provisions of NRS 543.340(4).
- The City follows the policies and procedures of the document as a partner agency of the CCRFCD.

GOAL: ASSURE THAT FACILITIES IN THE MASTER PLAN ARE MAINTAINED IN A MANNER THAT MAXIMIZES THEIR USEFUL LIFE AND ENSURES THEIR OPERATION AT DESIGN CAPACITY DURING A STORM EVENT.

401 WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION

AUTHORIZES

- Necessary routine maintenance activities undertaken with the use of tracked or wheeled vehicles for maintenance activities
- Use of temporary mats, structures, fill, and work to conduct maintenance work

ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS

- Notice of Intent (Similar to PCN)
- Protect Riparian vegetation when possible
- Threatened and Endangered Species
- Erosion and sediment control in stream zones, stream banks, and wetlands
- Dredged material stored and disposed of off site
- Best Management Practices
- Equipment
- Suitable material
- Quarterly report on activities

NATIONWIDE PERMIT 3

AUTHORIZES

- The repair, rehabilitation, or replacement of any previously authorized, currently serviceable structure or fill.
- The removal of accumulated sediment and debris within, and in the immediate vicinity of, the structure or fill.
- The repair, rehabilitation, or replacement of those structures or fills destroyed or damaged by storms, floods, fire or other discrete events
- The removal of accumulated sediments and debris up to 200-feet outside the immediate vicinity of existing structures.
- Temporary structures, fills, and work necessary to conduct the maintenance activity.

DOES NOT AUTHORIZE

- Maintenance dredging for the primary purpose of navigation.
- Beach restoration.
- New stream channelization or stream relocation projects.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS

- Pre-Construction Notification: Required for work outside of existing structure
- Written Verification Required
- Special Conditions
- Section 401 Water Quality Certification
- Aquatic Life: Life cycle movements, spawning Areas, shellfish Beds
- Migratory bird breeding areas
- Migratory Bird Treaty Act and Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act
- Threatened and Endangered Species
- Management of Water Flows
- Best Management Practices
- Equipment
- Suitable material
- Proper Maintenance

REGIONAL GENERAL PERMIT 7

AUTHORIZES

- Permanent and temporary discharges of dredged or fill material into waters of the U.S., including wetlands, needed to construct or maintain flood control facilities funded by or constructed in accordance with the CCRFCD program. Activity Limitations are:
 - Within the Las Vegas Valley Urban Boundary: The proposed activity shall not exceed 1 acre of wetlands, 5,000 linear feet of perennial or intermittent drainages, or 7,500 linear feet of ephemeral drainages.
 - In all other areas within Clark County: The proposed activity shall not exceed 1,000 linear feet of ephemeral drainages.


DOES NOT AUTHORIZE

- Activities conducted without a Department of Army permit
- Activities in Water of the United States that are subject to an ongoing federal enforcement action

- Pre-Construction Notification: New construction and dredging
- Written Verification Required
- Special Conditions
- Section 401 Water Quality Certification
- Migratory Bird Treaty Act and Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act
- Threatened and Endangered Species

- Mitigation
- Identify Activity Limits
- Equipment
- Suitable material
- Proper Maintenance
