## Stop Illegal Dumping

## Help protect our health and our environment

Only public employees may access public manholes for maintenance or monitoring activities. Others accessing a manhole may be illegally dumping, which may result in the following:

- Clogged or overflowing sewer lines
- Disruption of wastewater treatment plant processes
- Infrastructure damage
- Toxic or explosive gases
- Harmful discharges into Lake Mead
- Environmental damage

An example of an illegal discharge is a commercial vacuum truck, similar to the one depicted below, dumping its contents of grease interceptors, sand/oil interceptors or septic tanks.



Illegal dumping into public manholes is most likely to occur at night and away from major streets. If you see a potentially unauthorized discharge, please contact the Department of Utility Services' Pretreatment Section at (702) 267-2603.
